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# **Children's Dental Services**

### Who are we?

Children's Dental Services (CDS) is a non-profit, public health dental clinic that provides dental care to low income children and pregnant women. CDS is able to serve patients who have special needs or speak a language other than English.

#### Who do we serve?

- ♦ Children age 0-26
- Pregnant women
- Patients with any type of insurance
- ♦ Families eligible for sliding fee scale



### What do we offer?

- ♦ Screenings
- Onsite Dental Care
- ♦ Oral health education

## Why do we do it?

- ♦ Dental disease is the most common chronic childhood illness
- ♦ Dental issues cause 51 million hours of missed school time every year
- Oral health is essential to a child's overall health and school success

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# **Outreach**

CDS offers our knowledge, materials, and energy at school and community events! This is a great opportunity for families to ask any questions and sign up for on site dental care. Screenings can also be performed at these events!

#### Outreach is most often completed at the following school events:

- ♦ Open Houses and Back to School events
- Parent/Teacher Conferences
- ♦ Kindergarten Round-Up
- Any School event where families will be gathered

Oral Health Presentations are also offered during school hours. These are 30-60 minute oral education classes for all ages. Students will be taught about the importance of oral health and access to care.



# **Services for Your School**

CDS addresses the three main problems with accessing dental care:

- 1. Access to a dentist
- 2. Money for dental services
- 3. Language or cultural barriers
- Portable equipment is set up, taken down, and transported by trained CDS staff
- ♦ Follow-up care is easy and efficient
- Equipment is small enough to fit almost any room
- CDS has several sets of equipment, meaning that multiple sites can be served in one day



# **School Based Care**

### Who's eligible?

ALL STUDENTS ARE ELIGIBLE!

CDS accepts all public and private insurance and offers a sliding scale discount for families not eligible for medical assistance. Families who do not have insurance at the time of signing a consent will be contacted prior to care to discuss options.

#### **Active Consent**

- 1. Parents or guardians fill out a medical history and consent form to treat students. These are valid one year from the date signed.
- 2. By signing the form, parents consent to an exam and preventive services without a parent or guardian present.
- 3. If restorative care is required, parents are contacted and a treatment plan is discussed.

## **Verifying Consent**

All students will be identified before care using two checks:

- 1. Students are identified by a school staff member
- 2. A CDS provider will identify the student using information from the consent form

# **Screenings**

#### The Service

A screening is not done by a dentist and is not meant to replace regular visits to your family's dentist. The purpose is to determine which children have problems that need immediate attention from a dentist.

The time needed to screen an entire school greatly depends on student body size and school class schedule.

#### The Process

#### 1. Passive Consent

Letters are sent home one week prior to the screening. If a family does NOT wish to participate, the form must be filled out and returned.

### 2. The Screening

Trained CDS staff will arrive at school and screen all students who did NOT return the passive consent form.

### 3. Follow up

After screening, CDS sends a second letter home to all students who were screened. This letter will tell the family if a student has visible cavities and urgent dental problems.

A follow up phone call is also made to answer questions about the screening.
